Waking Women Up: The Gendered Nature of Populism in Contemporary Venezuela

A new form of populism has emerged during the presidencies of Hugo Chávez in Venezuela, supported by petrodollars disbursed through programs for the marginalized called *misiones*. The gendered nature of *chavista* populism differentiates it from other such movements in Latin America. This talk will explore the importance of gender to *chavista* populist discourse and social programs, focusing on three discursive frames -- militaristic, maternalist, and feminist – and the ways in which Chávez relates to women supporters as a paternal figure, a favored son, and even at times as a romantic partner.
