**Update on Impact of Climate Change on Peruvian Glaciers**

Profs. Thompson and Mark will discuss their research in the region of the Cordillera Blanca of Peru. Dr. Thompson has studied the Qori Kalis, Huascaran, Quelccaya, and Coropuna glaciers in Peru, as well as the Sajama glacier in Bolivia. Dr. Mark (Geography) and his colleagues investigate the physical and human dimensions of environmental change in glacierized landscapes. **Kate Bedford** (Kent Law School, University of Kent UK)***Embedding Neoliberalism: Crisis, Sexuality and Social Reproduction***

The talk seeks to intervene in a vibrant and publicly prominent debate within development studies about the role of crisis in 'postneoliberal,' or Post Washington Consensus policymaking. Gender and, especially, sexuality are largely absent from that debate. I ask: What do contemporary experiences of crisis reveal about the complex inter-connections between rupture and shock on one hand, and gender and sexuality on the other? In concrete crisis conditions, which common sense groundworks of the present (re Nikolas Rose) get unsettled, which get re-entrenched, and what is the role of the development industry in this process?

**Daniel Hellinger**, Professor of Political Science, Webster University***How Red is the Pink Tide in Hugo Chávez's Venezuela?***

Pres. Chávez has made it his goal to create "21st Century Socialism" in Venezuela. Critics and sympathizers alike wonder just what the president means by this phrase. Chávez has resisted any sweeping definition but made clear that socialism in Venezuela would be founded upon participatory democracy, solidaristic relations of production, and mixed, innovative forms of property. This presentation explores the limits and possibilities for construction of such a system by examining the advantages and disadvantages posed by dependence on oil exports and by Venezuelan political culture.

#### ***Electoral Observation: A Tool for Democratization and Peace in Latin America***

Formal electoral observation by credentialed international groups began in Latin America with the controversial but clean Nicaraguan election of 1984. The results of these efforts were studiously ignored by the mainstream press in the US. Since then, many dozens of elections in the region have undergone close international scrutiny, more sophisticated technology of observation has been developed, and new entities have become involved. Now, international observation can no longer be ignored in the US, even when US "enemies such as Hugo Chavez and Daniel Ortega are the victors. In addition to keeping the record straight throughout the world, international observation serves to reassure voters that the world is watching and to preserve peace throughout and following tense electoral contests.
