The Pachaysana Study Abroad Program is happy to announce five \$1000 scholarships available for the spring 2018 semester.

• 2 Coming/Breaking Out from the Margins Scholarships - If you identify with a group

that is marginalized from power, or if your identity has been marginalized by existing power structures, you can apply for this scholarship.

- 2 *Social Justice Ally* Scholarships If you consider that much of your identity/history is related to oppressive power structures but feel passionate about struggling for social justice and ending all forms of hate, then you can apply for this scholarship.
- 1 *Public (or under-represented) Institution* Scholarships Students from public institutions, as well as smaller or less affluent private schools, are underrepresented in our program. If you attend one of these institutions, you can apply for this scholarship.
