1. Quechua is the most spoken indigenous language in the Americas. You'll find it at airports, bus stops, schools, universities and more. It's a living language.



- 2. Did you know words like quinoa, llama and jerky hail from Quechua? The language offers a novel linguistic experience: no irregular verbs, no grammatical gender.
- Quechua is a gateway to another worldview. It's spoken by about 10 million people in the Andes highlands of South America, primarily in Ecuador, Peru and Bolivia.
- 4. You can expand your opportunities for research, travel, grants and fellowships such as a Fulbright and Foreign Language Area Studies (FLAS) fellowships.
- **5. Want to save the planet?** Quechua is part of the group of indigenous languages whose speakers are fighting to preserve Mother Earth.
